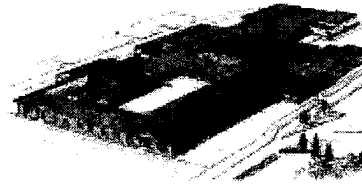

Scholarships

Average annual scholarship/grant awards to seniors during the past five years is in excess of \$700,000 per year. A Field Local Schools Endowment fund was established in 2000.

The Guidance Department

Provides a comprehensive program that addresses the academic, career and personal/social development of all students. The district employs two full time counselors. Services are also available from the district's full-time School Psychologist.

School District and Community

Field High School serves ninth, tenth, eleventh, and twelfth grade students of the Field Local School District. The school district consists of two adjacent southwestern Portage County Townships: Brimfield (population 10,365) and Suffield (population 6,300). The total population of the two townships is 16,665. Summit County borders Field Local School District on the west and Stark County on the south. The city of Akron is six miles west of the Suffield Township line. The city of Kent borders the district on the north. The Portage County Local School Districts of Rootstown and Waterloo border on the east.

Brimfield Township was developed as a residential community earlier than Suffield. The majority of the wage earners are employed in the greater Akron Area. Brimfield has been described in the past as a blue-collar community. The township is changing to a diversified laborer/middle management/professional residential area. Suffield is changing from a rural area to a broader base of occupations and incomes.

The Field Local School District was consolidated in December 1958, bringing together the Suffield School District (K-8). High school students in the Brimfield School District attended University High School. The Present Field High School building was built in 1961. An addition was built in 1982 and 2005.

Schedule

A strong academic program with more than 100 possible course selections including a vocational career curriculum, electives in art, journalism, music, foreign languages, mathematics, English, science, social studies, home economics, and technology.

About 65% of the student body takes college preparatory classes and another 25% participate in career education programs. The remaining 10% are in general programs or specialized services.

Advanced Placement courses are offered in English, Calculus and US History.

Honors courses are offered in English, science, mathematics, and history.

Students may enroll in college courses at local universities through the College Credit Plus program.

Special needs programs are available: Learning Disabled (LD), Developmentally Handicapped (DH), Multiple Handicapped (MH), Orthopedic and other health impairments (OH), Visually handicapped (VH), Hearing Handicapped (HH), and Emotionally Disturbed (ED).

Athletic Programs

Fifteen sports team with sex equity balance. Field is a member of the Portage Trail Conference; Metro League. Field is a Division IV public school.

Activities

Student Council, National Honor Society, French Club, Drama, Teen Institute, Ski Club, Yearbook, Journalism, Chorus, and Marching Band.

Class Rank/GPA

Class rank and GPA calculations will be made at the end of the first semester. Data base information includes all course work from grade 9 through the first semester of grade 12. (Grade 8 if the student has taken Honors Algebra 1).
