HOW TO PRACTICE LISTENING & SOUNDS

- Read & Recite
 Nursery Rhymes
- Read Dr. Seuss Books Aloud
- Make up Silly Rhyming Words

 - Sally sells seashells by the seashore.
- Count words in sentences or sounds in words
 - How many sounds do you hear in the word "clap"?
- Switch sounds in words - say "had"
 - now change the /h/to a /t/ can be real or silly words.

• Building Capacity of Parents

HOW TO HELP YOUR CHILD WITH COMPREHENSION

- Read books aloud that are interesting to your child, even if they are at a higher reading level.
- Read at a slower pace than normal with exaggerated expression.
- Tell them the meaning of big words that you say or read to them.
- Ask questions about the books they are reading - who, what, when, where, why.
- Point out text features that you see -heading, glossary, bold text, caption, index.
- Ask them how they can relate to what they hear or read.
