Course Offerings

11011 College Writing I

College Writing I is a Kent Core course designed to bridge the gap from high school writing to college writing. Writing is a rhetorical process focused on effective communication with the intended audience. This section of CWI focuses on argumentative writing and facilitates an enhancement of critical thinking. We will explore what it means to write effectively and work towards this in production.

21011 College Writing II

College Writing II satisfies a Kent Core requirement. The Kent Core as a whole is intended to broaden intellectual perspectives and prepare students for responsible citizenship and productive careers. This course focuses on analysis, research, and synthesis of information to create a new understanding of real-world problems.

22073 Major Modern Writers: British and United States

Major Modern Writers is a literature course that also satisfies a Kent Core requirement. Students will cultivate an understanding of British and American literature in its historical and cultural context of the Modern era, focusing on the aesthetic goals and literary methods of modernist and postmodernist literature. Throughout the course, students will further craft their skills in critical reading and writing.
